Curriculum

Upton Heath offers rich and memorable learning experiences that motivate and inspire our children to become independent and confident learners. We follow the national curriculum across all subjects. In maths there is a focus on fluency, reasoning and problem solving, and children enjoy using our additional resource Rock Star Maths. In writing, we provide phonics teaching that is rigorous, structured and enjoyable, whilst reading is taught through spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG) activities, child led groups and independent reading. Our curriculum at Upton Heath provides exciting learning opportunities to prepare happy, confident children for the future.

FOREST SCHOOL

At Upton Heath, we are lucky to have an inschool forest school provision called Branching Out and an extraordinary forest area. As a pupil at Upton Heath, your child will have the opportunity to experience forest school with Branching Out during the school year, from reception right through to year 6, led by our qualified and experienced forest school practitioners. Forest school has huge benefits for children, providing the perfect environment for holistic child development through essential life skills such as resilience, communication, problem solving and self-confidence.



Uniform

Uniform: Grey skirt, trousers or shorts. Blue shirt or polo shirt. Upton Heath cardigan or jumper. Summer: blue and white checked dresses or short sleeved blue shirts with grey shorts. For the health and safety of your child, strong, black school shoes are required. PE: White polo shirt or t-shirt. Navy/black shorts or gym skirt. Black plimsolls. Winter: A plain tracksuit for outdoor games. Children should bring their PE kit into school each week. The embroidered sweatshirt/cardigan is available from Uniformity in Handbridge www.uniformityschools.com. School book bags are available directly from our school office or Uniformity. Older children may use their own choice of school bag.



The school day

The school day starts at 8.45am for all children with registration at 8.55am and first lesson at 9.00am. All children have a morning break from 11-11.15am and reception, year 1 and year 2 have an afternoon playtime also. Lunch is 12.00-1.00pm for reception and year 1, whilst year 2 to year 6 have lunch between 12.15-1.15pm. Collective worship takes place daily. The school day ends at 3.15pm for foundation stage and key stage 1, and 3.30pm for key stage 2. We actively encourage children to walk/cycle/scooter to school and have a storage area which is locked during the school day.

Values and ethos

At Upton Heath, our ethos is 'learning together' reflecting our family orientation and our belief that children learn best where there is a strong partnership between school and home. Clubs and activities

We have a whole range of lunchtime and after school clubs at Upton Heath which are run by staff and outside companies and vary each term. These have included netball, cheerleading, multi skills, cross country, construction, Times Table Rock Star Club, art, ukulele, dance, floral design, drama and indoor athletics. Our School Parliament has an important role in the decisions made at Upton Heath Church of England Primary School. Representatives from each class meet regularly to discuss any issues or concerns that have been brought up by the children in school and to discuss new initiatives and ideas such as fundraising activities.
