

Letter from Mr North

Dear Parents/Carers,

I want to start off this week's letter by saying a huge thank you to our community for their support, patience and resilience in light of the latest updates and guidance from the UKHSA, PHE and DfE. I know that I gave you lots of information last week relating to COVID-19 and the new variant, as ever, this guidance continues to be updated, almost daily. We are monitoring these updates and will share information that is relevant to our community as soon as we can. As it stands, we continue to see a small number of positive cases in school, but not enough for us to meet further thresholds. We have had a review meeting with the Local Health Protection team today, who have confirmed that our actions and measures are suitable and effective.

Our Year 6 classes have been out to Min Y Don this week. I know that they have had an absolutely amazing time, and I would like to thank all of the staff for giving up their own time to support and plan the trip for our children. **THANK YOU!** Mrs Howie, Miss Barker, Mrs Britten, Mrs Morris, Mrs Allan, Miss Williams, Mrs Jones and Mrs Glover for your time, support, dedication, hard work and for updating us all via Twitter during the week.

It has been lovely to welcome back our colleagues from the Baptiste church and Holy Ascension, who have been leading worship with us mid-week. We look forward to enhancing our partnership with them over the coming months.

As you will be aware, especially in Acorns Class, Mrs Brocken is expecting her first baby in the New Year. Mrs Harrison and I have recruited another Miss Wilkinson, who has recently been working in an Outstanding school in Ellesmere Port and a local Chester school, to cover Mrs Brocken's maternity leave. Mrs Brocken is planning on leaving mid-January and Miss Wilkinson will start from 4th January, to ensure a good hand-over and transition. She has already been in school to meet the children and will be the class teacher for the rest of the academic year. Further staffing news, I have been asked by Hillside Primary School to extend Mr. Riley's secondment, as their Acting Deputy Headteacher, until the end of the academic year. Leave of Absence Request

Leave of absence during term time will not be authorised unless the reason meets the exceptional criteria. In response to your leave of absence request, a decision will be made and a letter sent to you within 5 working days. If leave of absence is authorised, a date to return must be agreed with the Headteacher. A child who is absent longer than the agreed date can be legally removed from the school register and the parent may be liable to prosecution.

When the leave of absence is 'unauthorised' and a child incurs 10 unauthorised absence marks in a term, i.e. five school days, the Local Authority may be informed and a fixed term penalty notice may be issued. The current rates payable by parents are £60 where the amount is paid within 21 days and £120 where the

amount is paid within 28 days. This charge is per parent/carer per child. If the fixed penalty notice rer unpaid this could lead to prosecution in the Magistrate's Court.	nains
